
Monthly Highlight

During the reporting period, intensified insecurity in Maw Taung, Tanintharyi Township, Mergui-Tavoy District, triggered displacement as civilians were forced to flee their hometowns in search of safety.

In parts of Doo Pla Ya and Hpa-an District, particularly in Hpa-an, Paing Kyone, and Myawaddy (MWD) Townships, changes in armed group presence led to clashes between the State Administration Council (SAC) and newly established armed actors in some locations. These incidents increased fear and uncertainty within communities, disrupted daily life, and heightened protection concerns. As a result, some households were forced to flee to safer areas, while others remained in place despite ongoing threats and instability.

In Mu Traw District, the IDP population rose to approximately 4,165 individuals, while 4,911 individuals were newly displaced in Billin township, Doo Tha Htu Distirct. These movements were primarily driven by heightened tensions, airstrike and fighting in around civilian areas, forcing families to flee their homes in search of safety.
